Early Education Center

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(BIRTH – AGE 3)

Early intervention services are provided **at no cost** to families in our service area (Barton, Rice, Stafford, Pawnee, and Rush counties). These services are designed to meet the needs of families with a child under the age of three that has a delay(s) and/or has been diagnosed with a disability. Our goal is to help overcome or lessen delays before your child turns 3 years old and starts preschool.

Our team is made up of early childhood special education teachers, speech language pathologists, physical therapist, social worker, and a Spanish translator. Anyone who suspects delays or has concerns about a child's development can make a referral to our program.


As part of our services, we assess a child's skills and provide intervention in six developmental areas: fine motor, gross motor, adaptive (self-help), cognitive, social-communication, and social/socialemotional. As a part of our evaluation we also screen hearing and vision. Services are provided in a child's natural environment using a primary service provider approach in which one consistent provider will work with the family and collaborate with the rest of the team to meet the family's needs. Family Service Coordination is also available to help families access needed resources and supports.

APPLIED BEHAVIOR ANALYSIS (ABA)

We provide in-home and clinic based Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) services to young children diagnosed with autism spectrum disorders (ASD). ABA is a therapy based on the science of learning and behavior. The goal of ABA therapy is to increase behaviors that are helpful and decrease behaviors that are harmful or interfere with learning. This service is adapted to the unique needs of each child and may involve one-on-one teaching, group instruction within a classroom setting, and/or parent training.

At this time, early intervention autism services are available to children who have received a diagnosis of autism until they enter Kindergarten.

Sunflower EEC also has a trained Autism Diagnostic Team that partners with KU Wichita Pediatrics to help children under the age of 3 receive a ASD diagnosis.
