The funds will allow us to purchase commercial-grade playground equipment for the approximately 50 children who enjoy their time outside.

"Playtime is essentially the work of a child," said Shelby Zuniga, Sunflower executive director. "Having up-to-date equipment on our playground will allow our professional staff to interact with toddlers in a safe and fun place.

"Physical and social skills, which are enhanced during playtime, are important aspects of any child's development," she added. "The 100+ People Who Care group has our heartfelt gratitude. We are blessed to be part of this caring community."

As of mid-October, bids were being sought to find the appropriate playground equipment.

100+ People Who Care will meet again at 5:30 p.m. Tuesday, Nov. 8 at the Best Western Angus Inn Courtyard. Sunflower representatives will share an update on the playground project at that time.

"Our colleague, Amanda Urban, suggested this as a possible fundraiser," said Cody Harris, director of planned giving and community support. "This is a first for Sunflower but we jumped at the idea.

"We appreciate Amanda's initiative and our non-profit agency's Foundation, which has given us its full support."

Proceeds from ticket sales go to the Sunflower Diversified Services Foundation, which purchased the vehicle. The Foundation exists to support Sunflower.

The 2022 Trailblazer ACTIV, which is a subcompact crossover SUV, is valued at \$29,540.

Only 5,000 tickets will be sold. The drawing is set for 6:45 p.m. March 30, 2023, during Sunflower's pancake feed at Prince of Peace Parish Center. Ticket holders do not have to be present to win.

"The support of this generous community allows us to offer more services to adults, as well as the children at our Early Education Center and Incredible Years Preschool," Cody emphasized. "Tax dollars provide a lot of support but not enough. Our fundraisers help fill the financial gaps for adaptive equipment, medical and dental services, and more."

McKinley Phillips Promotion

McKinley Phillips, Great Bend native, has been promoted to director of Sunflower Early Education Center (EEC), overseeing the three special programs at the non-profit entity.

The three programs are:

- Incredible Years Preschool
- Applied Behavior Analysis for children up to age 5 on the autism spectrum
- Kansas Early Childhood Developmental Services (formerly tiny-k) for children birth to age 3

"Since Heather Quillin, my predecessor, did a wonderful job training our staff, I was lucky enough to be handed a pretty well-oiled machine," McKinley said.

A couple of the new director's goals are to arrange for staff members to become even more engaged in the communities served by the EEC, and to provide more opportunities to support families.

"This agency and our families have become very special to me," McKinley commented. "Our dedicated staff has the passion to truly help children and families thrive. I have had many opportunities to watch parents' faces light up as their toddlers took their first steps or said their first words. There is nothing that compares, and I am thrilled to continue serving families in this new capacity."

Heather, who has worked with McKinley the past nine years, will continue as a part-time speech pathologist, while supporting her successor through the transition.

"McKinley's passion for the EEC, and the children and families we serve, make her a wonderful fit to take the lead," Heather said. "I am excited for the future of the EEC and grateful to still be part of the team."



Personal Accomplishments—Deacon

Deacon, who was diagnosed with Down Syndrome, loves to play with his siblings and parents but was unable to move throughout his home to reach them independently. Additional concerns included his social-communication skills; he was not yet attempting to babble.

The family came to our Early Education Center in October of 2021 when Deacon was 7 months old and began receiving services from McKinley Phillips and the rest of the team. McKinley has a degree in early childhood special education and is now the EEC's director.

"We have worked with Deacon and his family on exploring his environment independently," McKinley said. "He has started to roll and crawl, and is pulling to stand up and cruising around the house with the help of the furniture.

"Deacon uses a toy walker to find his siblings when he wants to play. In addition, while playing with Deacon's mom, Lacy, we were able to get him to take a few independent steps toward her during a recent home visit."

As Deacon began moving more throughout his home, his communication skills improved. He now labels several family members by their nicknames when he wants their attention.

Deacon also babbles silly sounds when playing with his family and is starting to let them know when he is hungry.

The teamwork between the EEC's professional and compassionate staff and an involved family demonstrates, once again, the importance of early intervention.
